

- Provide training & credit support services for income raising activities







7.3 RRF Programmatic Area

As a development organization, RRF plays a crucial role in addressing multidimensional challenges by working across vital sectors such as financial inclusion, skill development, sustainable food security, and agriculture. Its commitment extends to health, education, and gender equality, which are fundamental for societal progress. Moreover, RRF's focus on environmental sustainability, climate change, and cultural and sports initiatives ensures holistic community development. By integrating efforts across these areas, RRF fulfills its responsibility to uplift vulnerable populations and foster long-term resilience.



Financial Inclusion

This is defined **financial inclusion in Bangladesh** as access to **financial** services from officially regulated and supervised entities in which banks and **financial** institutions are licensed by the **Bangladesh** Bank, MFIs by the Microcredit Regulatory Authority (MRA). RRF **aims** to include everybody in society by giving them basic **financial** services regardless of their income or savings. It focuses on providing **financial** solutions to the economically underprivileged in Bangladesh. In particular, the poor need financial support for development in various sectors, and RRF is determined to increase the income of the poor from the very beginning to make sure their social and moral dignity.



Skills Development It has been accepted as true that human resource plays a vital role in the knowledge economy and working population and it is becoming an increasingly important factor for the performance of individuals, organizations and whole economies. However, the upgrading of skill-based labor market due to technological and organizational change is one of the major threats for the low skilled workers in Bangladesh, as they are being unable to adjust their skills according to the market demand. In this context, Rural Reconstruction Foundation in association with many associates and partners implementing different skills project in various trade.



Sustainable livelihood & Food Security

Rural Reconstruction Foundation's food security and livelihood projects, as well as dealing with issues regarding production, access and income to prevent and anticipate future outbreaks of malnutrition. In short, our intent is to improve a vulnerable community's access to sustainable sources of food and income. A livelihood is sustainable when it enables people to cope with and recover from shocks and stresses (such as natural disasters and economic or social upheavals) and enhance their well-being and that of future generations without undermining the natural environment or resource base. Livelihood skills include technical and vocational abilities (carpentry, sewing, weaving, and gardening, among others). RRF is addressing the livelihood skills to include the physical ability of household members to carry out activities regardless of their educational levels. Livelihood promotion is a set of development based interventions that involve improving the resilience of household livelihoods so that food and other basic needs can be met on a sustainable basis Interventions of this type entail strategies such as diversifying livelihoods strategies; creating alternative income is also a massive consideration.



Agriculture

In Bangladesh, about 80% of people live in rural area and the most part they depend on agriculture, forestry, fisheries, livestock and related activities for survival. Our intent for promotion of the rural economy in a sustainable way has the of increasing employment potential opportunities in rural areas, reducing regional income disparities, and ultimately reducing poverty at its very source. In addition, development of rural areas may contribute to the preservation of the rural landscape, the protection of indigenous cultures and traditions while rural societies could serve as a social buffer for the urban poor in periods of economic crisis or social urban unrest. RRF has been continuously implementing various types of agro-based projects with the help of various donor agencies over the years. Moreover, the organization is playing an important role in the development of agriculture through financial assistance to marginal and sharecroppers under the microfinance program. RRF is determined to take necessary steps considering agriculture as a priority.



Environment & Climate Change

Bangladesh is exceptionally vulnerable to climate change. It has been estimated that by 2050, one in every seven people in Bangladesh will be displaced by climate change. Up to 18 million people may have to move because of sea level rise alone. In addition, people all over the world, including Bangladesh, are already facing various problems due to climate change. For the poorest country like Bangladesh, tackling this issue is quite challenging. In this case RRF is working to promote social or political change on a broad scale or very locally. We play a critical part in developing society, improving communities, and promoting citizen participation and tries to impact the beneficiaries directly and indirectly as they sought sustainable solutions in various sectors such as finance, education, and healthcare. Our aim to increase capacity and to enrich and empower citizens so that they can improve their quality of life themselves. We are already implementing various projects with the help of different donor agencies on this issue, especially in coastal and disaster prone areas.



Bangladesh has made impressive progress in many of the health-related indicators over the past few decades. However, challenges still remain. Although Bangladesh is one of the few countries to achieve its Millennium Development Goal in reducing childhood mortality well ahead of 2015, the decline in under-five mortality has stalled in recent years. Maternal mortality ratio also fell sharply between 2001 and 2010, but has stagnated at 196 maternal deaths per 1,000 live Rural Reconstruction births since then. Foundation focuses on improving maternal and child health, expanding family planning and reproductive health, integrating family planning and nutrition into basic health care, and strengthening public health systems to improve the quality and availability of services across the country. Rural Reconstruction Foundation began Community Healthcare program with various healthcare services for the underprivileged rural people who are mainly underprivileged with regards to healthcare services in hard to reach areas. "Community Healthcare Program" is a much-needed intervention of Primary Health Care services to the doorsteps of rural people.



Education

Bangladesh has a substantial program of basic education both in formal and non-formal education with a large institutional network in this field. Besides a major effort in the public sector, a large number of local private or nongovernment organization are also involved in this effort. Rural Reconstruction Foundation involvement both in formal and non-formal basic



Advocacy & Network

Advocacy network, organization consisting of independent groups that collaborate in the pursuit of political and social change. The purpose of our advocacy is to promote or reinforce a change in policy, program or legislation rather than providing support directly to clients or users of services, which aims at winning support from others, i.e. creating a supportive environment. RRF highly appreciates to build network and advocate on the different issues with a view to remove different social disorder, and keens to do anything needed for human well-being. Some areas of our networking and advocacy are Sexual Violence, Confidentiality in Health Care, Education, Youth Leadership and Organizing, and so on.

RRF is implementing various programs with the government including the Directorate of Primary Education and the Department of Women's Affairs. It is a massive affiliation with Campaign for Popular Education (CAMPE) working on various issues of education. Since long, RRF has been proceeding direct affiliation with Couple of international Movement Belgium based International Agricultural Movement FIMARC and French-based international women platform Make Mothers Matters (MMM).

education is the magnitude of illiteracy and poverty that prevails in Bangladesh. Since its inception, the company has been playing an effective role in various sectors of education. We are working for the development of education on various issues of education on the basis of partnership with various government and nongovernment organizations. It is implementing various programs jointly with the government, especially in formal education activities.



Cultural & Human Development

As a part of inclusive initiatives for sustainable povertv reduction and beyond-poverty development, it is essential to patronize and promote mental & physical development of the young chaps in order to build a talented Nation as a whole. The main objectives are to create awareness among the young and adolescent's generation against all sorts of crimes as: terrorism, sexual harassment, drug abasement, and women-violence or oppression etc. It is not possible to solve all the problems as a whole by eradicating financial poverty. Sustainable human development will not be possible without integrating the development of human endowment with economic development. As part of a multi-dimensional program of sustainable poverty alleviation by integrating the practice of human scholarship with economic development, the practice of moral values, empathy, adolescent health and nutrition awareness, child marriage and sexual harassment. One of the main goals and objectives of this attempt by RRF is to build a civilized and progressive nation by organizing various social awareness and educational programs including various human development issues.

The following departments works to ensure smooth management of all the activities and programs of the organization and to ensure transparency and accountability and overall management.



Department of Admin & HRM

This department provides administrative and human resource development related support for the organization in terms of functional divisions- research, training, and knowledge management. It ensures coordination among the departments, top management, finance and accounts department with regards to different compliance issues. This department committed to address with is the organization's long-term vision and goals, it is carrying out administrative duties, like providing the tools the organization needs to successfully operate, discover new methods that move the organization forward and taking care of employees in terms of managing selection, recruitment, their increment, promotion, releasing. staff settlement. appraisal punishment, compensation issues, development, administration and many other issues. More importantly this department is highly responsible to handle all employee related matters like leave issues, medicals, housing, and general welfare issues. This department is also responsible to maintain the Procurement, Inventory & Assets Management, Vehicle Management, and services/Logistics like electricity, water, gas, telephone, fax, generator, IPS etc. This department is headed by a Director who is working under Executive Director of the organization.



Department of Finance & Accounts

The Finance and Accounts Department of Rural Reconstruction Foundation maintains the overall financial affairs & analysis and manages related budgetary activities of the aims to ensure organization, financial transparency of the regular activities. It prepares financial statements applying the "Generally Accepted Accounting System", International Accounting Standard", Accounting "Bangladesh Standard" and "Bangladesh Financial Reporting Standards". This controlling organ has been working from the very beginning of the organization's journey with full commitment to facilitate the organization's performance boosting to fulfill the desired goal. Fund raising from different sources is one of the key activities which is being done over the years whereas rest of the projects' financial management is very much noteworthy. Alongside this department is also responsible to facilitate the different project and organization's internal and external auditing, to develop financial guideline and accounts keeping. This department is headed by a Director who is working under Executive Director of the organization.



Department of Internal Audit

RRF Audit department provides some critical services to RRF management to ensure accountability and transparency of the organization. These include detecting and preventing fraud, testing internal control, monitoring and compliance of RRF and different development partners. The basic function of RRF internal Audit department is to find out the deficit of overall activities of the organization and to verify the errors that continue in activities implementation of each and every function at any level of the organization. It keeps working with national and international guideline practices. A 23 numbered hard working Auditor team is on action in physical crosscheck of all records and data during regular audit. Internal audit deals with the audit related affairs of both RRF and Donors. This wing is basically headed by an Assistant Director who exclusively reports to the Executive Director of the organization.



Department of Monitoring & Evaluation

In order to help improving performance and achieving results over the organization's planning, Rural Reconstruction Foundation set Monitoring and Evaluation Department in 1992. This governance wing basically controls the RRF internal mechanism, is directly managed by the Executive Director of the organization, and is mainly used to assess the performance of projects, institution and programs. RRF intends with regards to activities enhancing implement its all where capability organizational M&E department plays a significant role with its diversified contributions. Based on selected indicators of M&E framework which been set beforehand, this department conducts periodic monitoring and different length monitoring sessions over the need and demand from the projects and management of the organizations. This department put a massive contribution in effective implementation of microfinance program whereas; its focus goes to all projects of the organization as well. This department is led by a Deputy Director.



Department of ICT

RRF ICT department is mainly responsible for covering comprehensively the events of Website, Email, Wi-Fi, Internet, Microfinance Software, Hardware, Web develop, and all sort of IT based maintenance. At the edge of this communication era, RRF has been able to establish its ICT department from 2002 as a distinguished part of the organization, which contributes significantly in all the events of RRF wagon wheel. By building computernetworking system, now RRF can preserve data and information and can make report based on ICT information. This department is headed by a Deputy Director who is overseen by the Executive Director directly. This department can also generate software for various purpose based on organization's demands. A deputy Director runs this department right now.



Department of Training

Aiming to strengthen its human resource development and institutional framework, Rural Reconstruction Foundation established the Training department in 2003. This department is mainly responsible for the capacity building and professional development of all RRF staff and development professionals. Its overall goal is to improve the management competencies of development practitioners and enhance the human and operational skills of RRF staff and programs participants and the all stakeholders as well. This training department puts special emphasis on need based, customized training; the focus here is on integrated training modules rather than prototype training. In training participants' competence is taken into account and efforts are made to provide the participants new ideas and insights into the field of different development programs. This department is headed by a Director who reports exclusively to the Executive Director of the organization.



Department of Communication & Documentation

Rural Reconstruction Foundation started the department of Communication & Documentation from July 2014, with a view to invaluable document searching, provide versioning, comparison, and collaboration features on the basis of organization's demand. This Department is a part of the organization Staff Service, and is responsible with the indexing and archiving of all acts of organization. The Department also provides full reference service, which includes responding to requests for articles and information dealing with complex matters of interest to different projects and departments, and utilizing a variety of sources such as articles and electronic documentation. The Department responds to queries for information from the management and different department about activities and many other matters. This department is especially responsible for managing Organization's documents while also ensuring its accuracy, quality and integrity that help organization adhere to record retention policies, safeguard information and retrieve data more effectively. This department is responsible to initiate for publishing all sort of organization's publication both in electronic and printing forms i.e. e-news, newsletter, brochure, annual report, diary, calendar, IEC materials, and different sort of presentations. This is headed by a Deputy Director who is under Executive Director's overseen.

Socio-Economic Development

1. Microfinance

RRF is operating microfinance program in 32 districts in Bangladesh covering 7,353 villages supporting 2,82,597 beneficiaries. This program comprises a broad spectrum of Loan and Savings products. Right now it has 20 Loan Components and 14 Savings products. This program is financially supported by Palli Karma-Shayak Foundation (PKSF) and different commercial Bank. It intends to support people living in poverty in numerous ways by facilitating easy access to credit and savings, from enabling investment in small enterprises, to helping families maintain spending on food, and offering coping mechanisms for emergencies. It directly contributes to achieving different aspects of development with regards to extreme poverty, food security, health, education, gender equality, sanitation, livelihood, inclusive, economic growth and climate change resilience.

2. Remittance (Inward)

RRF is promoting remittance service from June 2009, has been render with the collaboration with Bank Asia Ltd, The City Bank Ltd. & Southeast Bank Ltd. This program extends to the entire microfinance area of the organization. This service is provided to the people who are staying in the particular areas of the respective offices under ongoing microfinance program. In fact, the microfinance staffs serve this door step services into the grass root level and hard to reach areas. The main goal of these services is to deliver the money that is being sent from the foreign countries to the receivers and helping the poor population as well as helping the economic development of the country in the process. It also helps to enhance the reputation of RRF in home and foreign countries and helps to attend the social responsibilities.

3. RRF Agent Banking

RRF has kicked off Agent Banking in association with Mutual Trust Bank (MTB) at Barinagar Bazar, Shatmile, Jashore from February 2018. Agent banking is limited scale banking and financial service for those living in remote areas across the country through persons under a valid agency agreement, rather than a teller or cashier, according to Bangladesh Bank agent banking guideline 2013, RRF has undertaken to promote this event into the rural areas.

4. RAISE (Recovery and Advancement of Informal Sector Employment)

Rural Reconstruction Foundation (RRF) undertook the 'Recovery and Advancement of Informal Sector Employment (RAISE)' project in September 2022 financed by World Bank and PKSF. The RAISE project will facilitate employability and increase productivity of informal sector, and provide financial assistance. The overall objective of the project is to enhance the access to earning opportunities for low-income youth, including COVID-affected youth in urban and peri-urban areas. Different kinds of trainings & loans are provided through this project.

RRF Technical & Vocational Department

5. Skills for employment investment program (SEIP)

Growth of the economy and employment opportunities in Bangladesh is restricted, among others by skills shortages. The current skill supply system does not meet the skill demand because of inadequate throughput and mismatch between supply and skills demand. The current production of skill workers is not focused on industry demand. Considering this factor, The Skills for Employment Investment Program (SEIP) is being implemented by the Finance Division, Ministry of Finance, ADB and Swiss Agency for Development & Cooperation (SDC). Rural Reconstruction Foundation has been implementing this program as a training Institute under the Umbrella of PKSF and Bangladesh Bank. This project kicked off from 27-12-2015.

6. Building Youth Employability Through Skills (BYETS)

The Building Youth Employability through Skills (BYETS) project, is financialy supported by the embassyof the kingdom of the Netherlands in collaboration with Swisscontact, addresses the challenge of skills shortages in Bangladesh, aiming to enhance economic growth and employment opportunities. The program, executed by the Rural Reconstruction Foundation (RRF) from August 2023 focuses on bridging the gap between skill supply and demand. By providing training programs by RRF that are aligned with the needs of the job market, the program ensures that the skills acquired by the youth are relevant and in demand. The project aims to support youths by providing training in three sectors: Readymade Garments (RMG), Agroprocessing (AP), and Information and Communication Technology (ICT). RRF is supporting in Information & Communication Technology (ICT) sector with its training resources and training center. In ICT sector srudnets can receive training on three particular tarde i,e: Web desiging & developing, Graphic designing and Digital Marketing.

7. Technical Skill training for Light Engineering in Jashore

RRF is the Training Partner of CIMMYT and IDE. So RRF was Completed the Training by the help of CIMMYT & IDE. Main objectives of this Training are to develop the skill workforce in Light Engineering sector at Jashore. Under USAID Funded Feed the Future Bangladesh CSISA -MEA Project, on February 13, 2022, RRF started skills training programme on "Skill Enhancement Training for Light Engineering Workforce in Jashore". The training program is being conducted at RRF Automobile Training & Service Center in the heart of Jashore city & Faridour Muslim Mission, in the side of Dhaka road with the participation of owners and employees of Faridpur Light Engineering Sector. At the end of the training, the participants of these courses have been achieving the objectives of the training & they will use their expertise to the workshop. This project gives special emphasis to the development of machine manufacturing skills of men. women and youth and the development of agricultural service provision business managed people. CIMMYT was taken initiative to development of Light Engineering Workforce under the umbrella of Cereal System Initiative for South Asia Mechanization Extension Activity (CISA-MEA) Project. CIMMYT are the International Maize and Wheat Improvement Center, known by its Spanish acronym, CIMMYT are a non-profit international agricultural research and training organization focusing on two of the world's most important cereal grains: maize and wheat, and related cropping systems and livelihoods. Financial supported by USAID from the American People by the recognition of Republic of Bangladesh.

8. PRABRIDHHI

The PRABRIDHHI project, funded by the Governments of Switzerland and Bangladesh and coimplemented by Swisscontact and the Local Government Division (LGD), is dedicated to fostering Local Economic Development (LED) in partner municipalities. The project's objective is to transform these municipalities into competitive regions that attract new businesses, support enterprise growth, create employment and income opportunities, and enhance the quality of life for citizens. The Jashore handicraft sector, primarily led by women CMSMEs, focuses on Jashore Stitch and textile products. These entrepreneurs operate from home or small workshops, relying on years of experience for product design and business operations. However, the sector faces challenges. PRABRIDHHI has supported Jashore handicrafts, particularly Jashore Stitch, since 2021. Initiatives include capacity building, innovative design, product development, and market linkages. PRABRIDHHI collaborated with leading women entrepreneurs to enhance design skills and product quality through co-creation workshops. They also developed a comprehensive training manual based on needs assessment and conducted ToT for selected entrepreneurs to train their artisans. As part of the institutional capacity building of the local, Rural reconstruction Foundation (RRF) working from September 2023 in Jashore by conducting the trainings in the handicrafts sector. Authority (NSDA), PRABRIDHHI and RRF jointly developed an intervention plan to facilitate institutionalization of the skills development initiative for the handicrafts entrepreneurs of Jashore.

9. National Human Resource Development (NHRD)

The National Human Resource Development Fund (NHRDF) was established with the mission of transforming unskilled and semi-skilled workers into productive, skilled human resources in key sectors. It aims to support government institutions, private companies, non-government organizations, industry skill councils, and industry associations in achieving this goal. NHRDF is using part of its funds, provided by the Government of Bangladesh, to facilitate skills development among the youth in these priority sectors. As part of this initiative, Rural Reconstruction Foundation (RRF) is conducting training programs aimed at empowering young people in society. With over a decade of experience in vocational training, RRF has developed a seasoned workforce capable of successfully driving this project and contributing to the overall mission of NHRDF.

Sustainable Livelihood & Food Security

10. ENRICH

With the technical and financial assistance of Pally Karma-Sahayak Foundation (PKSF), Rural Reconstruction Foundation (RRF), a national legendary non-government humanitarian organization in Bangladesh, has been implementing the "Enhancing Resources and Increasing Capacities of the Poor Households towards Elimination of their Poverty" (ENRICH) program at three Unions; Andulbaria, Hashadah and Raypur of Jibonnagar Upazila under Chuadanga District and Godaipur Union under Paickgacha Khulna. The ENRICH has been distinctively designed to target such issues which ensures the household-based sustainable development. It attaches high importance to creating capabilities of and establishing an enabling environment for the people to improve their socio-economic conditions and reach a level of living which is humanly dignified, within as a short time as possible. It aims to make the poor households enriched through eradicating their poverty and enhancing their abilities. It follows a life cycle approach-from conception to grave. At each identifiable level of life, there are programs. There are services for pregnant and lactating mothers, newborn children and adolescents, youth, adults, and elderly people.

11. Uplifting the Quality of the Lives of the Elderly People

Rural Reconstruction Foundation (RRF) began to implement "**Uplifting the Quality of the Lives of Elderly People**" program from July 2017. RRF in association with PKSF through its various innovative activities has been playing a vital role for the country's sustainable development. The key intension of this attempt is working for improving the living standard of senior citizen and aims to sustain the development through different kind of innovative activities. This is of course, elderly people not as a client, but as a man and serving them in a way so that it does not hurt their self-esteem. These project activities are designed by putting people in the center and upholding the human dignity. RRF is implementing this project in one union of Khulna district and 3 unions of Chuadanga district.

12. The Pathways to Prosperity project (PPEPP)

Rural Reconstruction Foundation started implementing the project "Pathways to Prosperity for Extremely Poor People" from January 2020 in Bagerhat and Khulna districts in partnering with Pally Karma-Sahayak Foundation (PKSF). This program is funded by the UK's Department for International Development (DFID) and the European Union (EU). The Pathways to Prosperity project will help the extremely poor people to connect with mainstream development activities and economic growth. It aims to deliver the results and higher level changes through following six interrelated and multidimensional components: Livelihoods (resilience building and value-chain development), Nutrition and Health, Community Mobilisation, Market Development, Policy Advocacy, and Life-Cycle Grant Pilot. The Project has three cross-cutting areas – Disability, Disaster and Climate Resilience, and Women's Empowerment Leading to Gender Equality.

13. Senior Citizen Welfare Program

The experience and wisdom of the senior citizens can guide the youth towards a better and more prosperous future. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) cannot be achieved leaving anyone

behind, and empowering senior citizens is as important as ensuring their welfare. Our heart's conviction toward inclusive development and social dignity of the elderly." Today's these older people were once a young people, they created the next generation. They sacrificed their golden time with over the years for this generation. Today's colorful world is their creation. Recognizing them is our moral duty. RRF has 4 Elderly Club in Sadar, Sharsha and Jhikorgacha Upazilla of Jashore district delivring various services to 450 elderly people.

Agriculture

14. Rural Microenterprise Transformation Project (RMTP)

Sub-project: Production and Marketing of Safe fish & fish products

The Rural Microenterprise Transformation Project (RMTP) comprises a sub-project titled "Production and Marketing of Safe Fish & Fish Products." Implemented by RRF funded by PKSF & IFAD. Its primary goal is to increase the income of small and marginal fish farming families and small entrepreneurs, ensuring food security and improved family nutrition. This sub-project under RMTP seeks to uplift rural communities by fostering safe and sustainable fish production and marketing practices. The objectives of the project is to Increasing the income of entrepreneurs through fish production & marketing. It also aimed at increasing participation of women and youth in initiatives. The project duration is 2 years 6 month.

15. Green Biotech (Tissue Culture Lab)

Tissue Culture Lab is a new addition to the organization, which gives an excellent level of excellence to the agricultural department of the organization. Especially the organization has been working on two decades on floriculture. In the meantime, it has implemented multi-functional activities for the marketing of flowers, involved the farmers in cultivating new species of flowers. Based on the demand of local farmers and country's market, in association with PKSF, the organization has established a tissue culture lab from September 2018. It aims to Produce Sapling of Flowers mother plant within the country and make availability of sapling to the farmers at Low price. The ultimate goal of this project is to increase farmer's income, livelihood and extension of floriculture through supplying quality, germ free healthy sapling. This porgram is now being implemented with its own support.

16. Stregthning Climate-Smart vegetable and Flower Value Chain Project

From July 2023 Rural reconstruction Foundation is implementing this project in two upazilas of the Jashore district, an area characterized by dry weather and floodplain soils with high organic content. With the financial and technical support of Heifer International: Strengthening Climate-smart Vegetable and Flower Value Chain (C4VFVC) project aims to enhance the agricultural value chain in the Jashore district of southwestern Bangladesh. Every year, a significant number of harvested produces (including vegetables and flowers) are wasted due to seasonal gluts and a lack of post-harvest management, including facilities for preservation and storage, and proper transportation systems and marketing networks. In Bangladesh, different types of agricultural markets (i.e., rural local market, rural assembly market, rural secondary market, urban retail market, etc.) exist, where agricultural products are traded. The vegetable and flower marketing systems are problematic and un-organized, and it needs to be improved to minimize price fluctuations and ensure a fair price for producers and consumers. The C4VFVC project will be implemented in Jashore district of southwestern Bangladesh. Salinity intrusion and coastal flooding due to rising sea level is one of the most important causes of environmental and socio-economic vulnerabilities in this area.

17. Project Name: Feed the Future Bangladesh Horticulture, Fruits, and Non-Food Crops Activity Sub-project: Enhancing Banana Production and Marketing in the Southern Delta of Bangladesh

RRF implemented a project name Enhancing Banana Production and Marketing in the Southern Delta of Bangladesh supported by Chemonics International Inc. (USAID). The project participants are 1000 farmers who are cultivating banana. The Primary Goal of the project is to ensure supply of quality Banana through safe Banana production and marketing and increase their income. The project last for 1 year from 07th June 2023 06th June 2024. It is implementing in 4 areas of Bangladesh those are Jashore, Jhenaidah, Chuadanga & Meherpur. RRF wants to increase the safe banana production by which banana cultivators get benefited. The project is not only about increasing banana production

but also to introduce Banana Fruits Bag and other management practices for safe production. It also supports the banana farmers on improved banana production technologies, post-harvest Management & linkage with local, regional & national buyers.

Environment & Climate Change

18. Resilient Homestead and Livelihood Support to the Vulnerable Coastal people of Bangladesh (RHL)

The Resilient Homestead and Livelihood Support to the Vulnerable Coastal people of Bangladesh Projects aims to enhance the resilience of targeted people to climate change through adopting and practicing adaptive activities in the Project Area. With the support of PKSF, RRF is implementing this project from 2024 in the Morelgonj Upazila of Bagerhat district has been selected based on exposure, vulnerability and feasibility of crab hatchery. They will be able to identify the impacts of climate change on their lives and livelihoods and prepare plans for addressing those impacts through climate change adaptation groups ("CCAGs"). Aligning the stated specific objectives, the Project will construct climate resilient homesteads for the most vulnerable households, Climate adaptive farming technologies e.g., crab fattening along with mangrove tree plantation, Sheep/goat rearing, household-based agriculture etc. The project follows agriculture and food security sector guidelines while designing climate resilient livelihoods.

19. Disaster & Emergency Response

From 2023, Rural Reconstruction Foundation, in partnership with WASTE, Netherlands, is collaborating on the "Financial Inclusion Improves Sanitation & Health" project. This initiative aims to establish integrated and sustainable WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) and waste management services by encouraging private sector participation. Finish Mondial is a global program which is being implemented simultaneously in 6 countries of the world including Bangladesh. The goal is to sustainably add 10,000,000 people worldwide by 2025 among the workforce Involvement in sanitation. The project focuses on developing businesses related to safe sanitation and solid waste management while promoting an inclusive management system. It involves social business organizations, informal workers, and cooperatives in the waste and sanitation sectors. The project's comprehensive approach encompasses the entire waste management value chain—from generation to ultimate disposal—aligning with the municipality's goals of providing efficient waste collection, sanitation services, and ensuring a clean, green, safe, and climate-resilient city.

20. Renewable Energy Project (NATP-2)

From April-2019, RRF has begun Biogas Project under having support from the department of Livestock of Bangladesh Government. Every single district of Khulna division of Bangladesh is covered under this project whereas the target group is Common Interest Group (CIG) under Upazilla Livestock Department. The main objective of the Second Phase of the National Agriculture Technology Program Project for Bangladesh is to increase the agricultural productivity of smallholder farms and improve smallholder farmers' access to markets within the country. The main focus of this project is in strengthening the capacity of research, extension services and farmers to generate, adopt and diffuse agricultural technologies aimed at increasing farm productivity and reducing post-harvest losses; and promoting the sustainability of existing and newly created farmer groups and producer organization by facilitating their stronger participation in commodity value chain, market-linkages, and improving their knowledge and skill base.

21. Building Resilient Services and Infrastructure for climate-affected migrated slum communities in Satkhira Bangladesh

The progress report covers one month of the **Building Resilient Services and Infrastructure for climate-affected migrated slum communities in Satkhira Bangladesh (tailoring, embroidery, masonry, electric wiring, carpentry, etc.)** project. The CBF in partnership with the Habitat for Humanity Bangladesh (HFHB) and Rural Reconstruction Foundation (RRF) is delivering an integrated community-based development project in four words (Miya Saheber danga, Sukhrali-Bosepara, Eka Gachha east para, and Roispur-Bagbati) of Satkhira Municipality in Satkhira districts, where 225 beneficiaries and 80 families are directly benefited from these projects. 75 beneficiaries are trained in livelihood training, 150 beneficiaries benefit from wash training and climate adaptive insulation devices benefit 80 families. In **Building resilient services and infrastructure for climate-affected migrated slum communities in Satkhira Bangladesh (tailoring, embroidery, masonry, electric wiring, carpentry, etc.)** project selected beneficiaries are getting livelihood support like washing, Tailoring, embroidery, vegetable seeds, sewing machines, tube well with bath, Tools, Communal Toilet, drainage, and so on. 225 beneficiaries and 80 families are being benefited from the DRR project. In the DRR project selected beneficiaries are getting awareness and seed support for reducing and facing the threat of natural calamities and livelihood support. Through this project, beneficiaries are learning about Climate.

Health

22. Community Healthcare Program

Rural Reconstruction Foundation driven "Community Healthcare Program" is an absolutely outreach project. Mainly, RRF planned to establish few Community Healthcare centers at the village level to extend Primary Health Care at the door step of the rural people especially to the beneficiaries of all RRF program and project in its working areas. RRF "Community Healthcare Program" basically seeks to ensure complete healthcare services in grass route level.

Even the country's healthcare status has reached a crossroads where success can be rejoiced but those could be short-lived if certain challenges are not met. Still lots of gaps are making some concern in this regards. From the Social Commitment, Rural Reconstruction Foundation started "Community Healthcare Program" from September, 2015 without being depended for having any financial support from outside. This program has been designed in the light of Government of Bangladesh driven Community Clinic which is financially backed by RRF itself.

Education

23. Barnamala Bidyapith (Formal Education)

Barnamala Bidyapith an absolutely formal education program, which is operated according to the current mainstream national curriculum. This institution's goal is not only to provide the highest quality teaching, but also to inculcate the values essential for tomorrow's leaders. Our teaching team who are capable of teaching the most challenging and up-to-date educational program and empowering them with knowledge and life skills so that they can take on the challenges of building themselves and a better nation. 7 number of Formal Schools RRF has which all have government accreditation from the Ministry of Education and Jashore Education Board. The teaching learning activities are being conducted from Play group to Grade Ten.

24. Pre-School (Non Formal Education)

RRF pre-primary schools provide a 1-year program targeting students from disadvantaged and nonliterate families. Basically, RRF promotes community based pre-school in small scale in its working areas.

RRF has a strong relationship with the government primary school system, as children who participate in RRF's pre-primary school program only go on to study in government primary schools afterwards. An important factor in determining students' enrollment rate in primary schools from pre-primary schools has been the physical proximity of the latter to the former. Our pre-primary schools are therefore located very close nearby Government School, in order to facilitate this transition.

RRF pre-primary schools provide children with a foundational skills base in literacy, reading and mathematics, and seek to promote children's emotional and physical development for success in primary school. Class hours are flexible and no tuition is charged. Teachers are women from the local community who. The student-teacher ratio is kept low at around 1 teacher

25. Internship

Internship roles are ideally an integral part of RRF. Therefore, RRF internship is considered in line with our organization's philosophy and practice so it benefits our productivity, revenue and staffing goals. The internship experience is mutually beneficial for RRF and Interns either. The essence of Internship is to provide training and experiential learning opportunities for the development of skills in assessment, counseling, crisis intervention, consultation, outreach, and supervision which make a winwin situation both for RRF and Internees. It also provides a professional working environment that encourages and gives space to professional identity development and the development of

professional competence. The provision of length of internship can also be dictated by the duration of a school break; for instance, summer internships and winter internships are common, and take place over the course of a summer or winter vacation. There are various issues for internship topic which are consistent with the organization's activities and students' curriculum.

Cultural & Human Development

26. Adolescent Program

Right now in our country, there are 3 Crore and 60 Lakh adolescents, which is 21% of the total population. Palli Karma-Shayak Foundation (PKSF) has adopted a program for adolescent to make the nation's beautiful growth, Rural Reconstruction Foundation has been implementing this project in Jessore, Khulna, Bagerhat and Meherpur districts from July 2019. A human development project namely "Adolescent Program" has been adopted to develop the social, human, emotional and physical capacity of adolescents to sustain the country's development. Under the adolescent program, the development of moral values and social awareness, adolescence and health awareness, cleanliness-food and nutrition awareness, leadership development & skill development and cultural and sports activities are being implemented which will prevent various social disadvantages of the country. The main objective of the program is to encourage adolescents to earn honest virtues, practice truthfulness, attain moral values, nurture advanced science, and encourage progressive practices.

Gender

27. Positive change in gender norms and harmful behavior for inclusive and resilient communities.

Gender-based violence is one of the most prevalent human rights violations in the world. It knows no social, economic or national boundaries. Worldwide, an estimated one in three women will experience physical or sexual abuse in her lifetime. RRF implemented a project called Positive change in gender norms and harmful behavior for inclusive and resilient communities funded by UNFPA. The aim of the project is to Civil society and the women's movement enjoy expanded political space and support to effectively represent women and girls, particularly the most marginalized, to drive policy and social change for the promotion of gender equality and elimination of GBV. Positive change in gender norms and decreased acceptance of gender-based violence and harmful practices, including among vulnerable groups, contributing to more inclusive and resilient communities. Gender and Social Norms By 2025, Strengthened mechanisms and capacities of actors and institution to address discriminatory gender and social norms to advanced gender equality and women's decision making.

Others

28. RRF Training & Resource Centre

RRF Training and Resource Centre (RRF TARC), the apex training institute in the southern part of the country, emerged as a philanthropic institute in 07 November 1991 under Rural Reconstruction Foundation. The essence of this TARC's emergence is to create skill human resource for social development, to assist small NGO and poor community people through training activities and conduct different types of researches. This training center is located in a pleasant environment surrounded by green nature which is 8 kilometers far from Jashore Town. Currently, various NGOs, government organizations, corporate company, and social organizations hire this venue for arranging various events. RRF made a radical move to start in commercial approach to make this institute sustainable.
