A consultant, alongside the RRF team, conducted a focused group discussion (FGD) in Phingri Village, Satkhira Sadar, on 18th November 2024. The session aimed to gather data on water and sanitation challenges for developing a climate-resilient WASH product catalog, addressing critical community needs amidst climate change impacts.

PIMC Meeting Held to Strengthen Upazila-Level Coordination: Heifer International



A Project Implementation and Management Committee (PIMC) meeting was held on 25th November 2025, presided over by UNO Bhupali Sarkar. Attended by 22 participants, including 8 women, the meeting engaged Upazila officials and cooperative leaders to discuss project progress, address challenges, and enhance coordination with local government units for resource and service optimization.

Climate Resilient Project(CBF): conducted FGD at field level



On 18th November 2024, officials from Habitat for Humanity visited the field for a mid-term evaluation of the ongoing project. During their visit, they conducted a focus group discussion session with committee members to assess the progress of the project work and ongoing activities. This evaluation aimed to gather insights and feedback to ensure the successful implementation of the project.



To increase local green cover, engaging the community and addressing climate change Fruits and medicinal plant saplings distribution and planting activities were conducted on 11 & 12 November at Nishanbaria and Jeodhara Union under Morrelganj, Bagerhat. 3350 climate-resilient saplings were distributed among 518 families. Among the plantations were Coconut, Betel nut, Neem, Sapodilla and Wood apple. A total of 6700 vards of net is provided for the maintenance of tree saplings. The Focal Person of the project Kbd. Dr. Asit Baran Mondal, Senior Assistant Director, RRF was present during the event. Continued efforts and monitoring will be done to ensure the sustainability of the planted trees and to further promote biodiversity in the region

Ongoing construction work visit at Satkhira: Under OVG Project



Under the OVG project, efforts are underway to improve the living standards of Dalit communities in Satkhira. Currently, 16 new houses are being built, 20 houses are undergoing renovations, and 14 sanitary toilets along with 4 deep tubewells and bathhouses are under construction. Officials from Habitat for Humanity visited the site to assess the progress of these ongoing construction works and ensure the project's objectives are being met.

Age-Based Ideal Food and IYCF Exhibition Held: PPEPP-EU Project

On November 9, 2024, an **Age-Based Ideal Food Selection and IYCF Exhibition** was organized under the **PPEPP-EU project** at the Mother and Child Forum in Ramchandrapur, Morelganj, Bagerhat. The event aimed to educate community members on the importance of providing age-appropriate nutrition for children and mothers. Through interactive sessions and demonstrations, participants gained valuable insights into the nutritional needs of different age groups and how to meet them effectively.

They have completed their 5th assessment and are preparing for the final evaluation, which will be conducted by NSDA officials in person. The Food and Beverage Production course equips students with essential culinary skills, knowledge of food safety standards, and practical experience in the hospitality industry. It prepares them for careers as professional chefs, restaurant managers, or entrepreneurs in the food sector. The certification from NSDA adds credibility, enhancing their employability in both local and international markets.

PKSF & Consultant Visit: RMTP Project
